I. DECISIONS TAKEN BY THE CONFERENCE OF THE PARTIES¹

Decision 1/COP.2

Ordinary sessions of the Conference of the Parties

The Conference of the Parties,

Recalling article 22, paragraph 4 of the Convention, related to the convening of ordinary sessions of the Conference of the Parties,

Bearing in mind that the Conference of the Parties should adopt the budget during its ordinary sessions,

1. *Decides* that the fifth ordinary session of the Conference of the Parties shall take place in the year 2001, and that thereafter ordinary sessions shall be held every two years;

2. *Decides also* that the sixth ordinary session of the Conference of the Parties shall be held in the year 2003;

3. *Invites* the secretariat to make the necessary arrangements for the forthcoming ordinary sessions of the Conference of the Parties in accordance with this decision and relevant provisions of the Convention.

Decision 2/COP.2

Programme of work for the Conference of the Parties

The Conference of the Parties,

Recalling article 22 of the Convention,

Recalling also its decisions 9/COP.1 on its work programme, 10/COP.1 on review of the implementation of the Convention and 11/COP.1 on procedures for the communication of information and review of implementation,

1. *Decides* to include the following selected items in the agenda of its third session and, if necessary, its fourth session:

(a) Review of reports on implementation of affected African country Parties, including on the participatory process and on experiences gained and results achieved in the preparation and implementation of national action programmes;

(b) Consideration of progress made in the formulation and implementation of subregional and regional action programmes in Africa;

(c) Review of reports by developed country Parties on measures taken to assist in the preparation and implementation of action programmes, including information on financial resources they have provided, or are providing, under the Convention;

(d) Review of information provided by relevant organs, funds and programmes of the United Nations system, as well as other intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, on their activities in support of the preparation and implementation of action programmes under the Convention;

(e) Review of activities for the promotion and strengthening of relationships with other relevant conventions and relevant international organizations, institutions and agencies;

(f) Consideration of procedures and institutional mechanisms for the resolution of questions on implementation, in accordance with article 27 of the Convention, with a view to deciding how to take this matter forward;

(g) Consideration of annexes containing arbitration and conciliation procedures, in accordance with article 28, paragraphs 2(a) and 6, of the Convention;

(h) Consideration of some specific conclusions and recommendations made by the Committee on Science and Technology relating to affected country Parties' experiences and constraints in the implementation of action programmes;

2. *Decides also* to include the following selected items in the agenda of its fourth session and, if necessary, its fifth session:

(a) Review of reports on implementation of affected country Parties, of regions other than Africa, including on the participatory process, and on experiences gained and results achieved in the preparation and implementation of national action programmes;

(b) Review of the report on progress made in the formulation and implementation of subregional and regional action programmes in regions other than Africa;

3. *Requests* the secretariat of the Convention to circulate in all official languages at least three months prior to the third session of the Conference of the Parties a provisional annotated agenda, and appropriate documentation for that session, reflecting the decisions in paragraphs 1 and 2 above.

Decision 3/COP.2

Administrative and support arrangements for the secretariat,
including interim arrangements

The Conference of the Parties,

Recalling its decisions 3/COP.1 on the designation of a Convention secretariat and arrangements for its functioning, administrative and support arrangements, and 4/COP.1 on interim arrangements for the Conference of the Parties and for the Convention secretariat,

Recalling also United Nations General Assembly resolution 52/198 of 18 December 1997 on implementation of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification in those Countries Experiencing Serious Drought and/or Desertification, Particularly in Africa,

Taking note of the secretariat report on institutional and interim arrangements for the Conference of the Parties and the Convention secretariat,¹

1. *Accepts* the arrangements as outlined in the secretariat report referred to in the preamble to this decision;

2. *Notes* with appreciation the appointment by the Secretary-General of the first head of the Convention secretariat in accordance with its decision 4/COP.1, paragraph 4;

3. *Calls on* the General Assembly, bearing in mind the institutional linkage of the Convention secretariat to the United Nations and the large number of States, including those which are on the list of least developed countries, that are Parties to the Convention, to decide to finance from the regular programme budget of the United Nations the conference servicing costs arising from sessions of the Conference of the Parties and its subsidiary bodies for the duration of the institutional linkage approved by the General Assembly, including the fourth and fifth sessions of the Conference of the Parties and meetings of its subsidiary bodies in the calendar of conferences and meetings for 2000-2001;

4. *Requests* the Executive Secretary to transmit to the General Assembly the report and decisions of its second session;

5. *Reiterates* its appreciation to Governments, the United Nations system, multilateral financial institutions, intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations that have supported the interim secretariat;

6. *Invites* the international community, the United Nations system, including the Bretton Woods institutions, intergovernmental organizations, non-governmental institutions and the private sector to continue to support and cooperate with the Convention secretariat and requests the Executive Secretary to collaborate with those entities with a view to reaching understandings that specify the nature of the cooperation and support that each entity would provide.

Decision 4/COP.2

Agreement concerning the headquarters
of the permanent secretariat of the Convention

The Conference of the Parties,

Recalling its decision 5/COP.1 of 10 October 1997, by which it accepted the offer of the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany to host the secretariat of the Convention,

Also recalling that the headquarters agreement was signed on 18 August 1998 and that an exchange of notes forming part of the agreement took place on the same day,

Bearing in mind the note by the secretariat on the headquarters agreement¹ and the statement made by the delegation of Germany on the successful conclusion of the headquarters agreement and its speedy entry into operation,

Noting that the Federal Republic of Germany has issued an ordinance, which became effective on 23 October 1998, implementing major parts of the headquarters agreement under German law, and further noting that article 3, paragraph 3, article 4 and article 5 of the headquarters agreement require ratification by the Federal Republic of Germany,

Noting with satisfaction that the said ratification is nearing completion,

Approves the agreement signed in Bonn on 18 August 1998 concerning the headquarters of the Convention secretariat, subject to its ratification by the Federal Republic of Germany and requests the Executive Secretary to report to the Conference of the Parties at its third session on this matter if necessary.

Decision 5/COP.2

Procedures for the communication of information
and review of implementation

The Conference of the Parties,

Recalling article 22, paragraphs 2(a) and (b), article 23, paragraph 2(c), and article 26 of the Convention,

Reaffirming decision 11/COP.1 on procedures for the communication of information and review of implementation,

Having considered the review of the implementation of the Convention and of its institutional arrangements, including support to regional action programmes,¹

1. *Recalls* that, at its third session, in 1999, it shall examine the reports of affected African country Parties and, at its fourth session, in 2000, the reports of affected country Parties in other regions;

2. *Recalls also* that developed country Parties shall report, at each session, on measures taken to assist action programmes of those affected developing country Parties reporting for the session, and that relevant organs, funds and programmes of the United Nations system, and other intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, are invited to do likewise;

3. *Recalls further* that reports are to be submitted in conformity with the procedures for the communication of information and review of implementation contained in decision 11/COP.1;

4. *Calls upon* Governments, the United Nations system and all other interested organizations, including non-governmental organizations and the private sector, to provide technical and financial support with a view to assisting affected African country Parties for the compilation and communication of information to be submitted to the Conference of the Parties at its third session, in 1999, for consideration, as well as identifying the technical and financial needs associated with action programmes;

5. *Requests* the secretariat to report to the Conference of the Parties at its third session on its activities related to paragraph 24 of the procedures contained in decision 11/COP.1 and article 23, paragraph 2(c), of the Convention.

Decision 6/COP.2

**I. Adjustment to the Convention budget
and programme for 1999**

The Conference of the Parties,

Recalling its decision 6/COP.1, whereby, *inter alia*, it approved a core budget in the amount of US\$ 6,100,000 for 1999 and requested the Executive Secretary to report to the Conference of the Parties, at its second session, any proposed adjustments to the budget for 1999,

Further recalling its decision 7/COP.1, whereby, *inter alia*, it took note of the estimated requirements for 1999 for the Supplementary Fund and the Special Fund, submitted by the Executive Secretary, and requested him to report thereon to the second and third sessions of the Conference of the Parties and to propose any related adjustments that might be required for 1999,

Having considered the report on adjustments to the Convention budget for 1999 submitted by the Executive Secretary¹,

A. The core budget

1. Approves the revised core budget of the Convention for 1999, as the second year of the biennium 1998-1999, amounting to US\$ 6,100,000, for the following purposes, not including conference servicing costs:

3. *Decides* that the Executive Secretary, for the purpose of the 1999 budget, shall make savings equivalent to the special annual contribution of the Government of Germany to finance Convention events organized by the secretariat (see paragraph 7 below), in calculating the contributions of Parties to the 1999 budget in a manner that the amount to be shared among the Parties shall total US\$ 4,956,800 as the Parties have already budgeted for 1999;

4. *Requests* the Executive Secretary to continue negotiations with the Secretary-General of the United Nations on the issue of an allotment of overhead for the financing of additional posts or activities in the administrative area of the secretariat;

5. *Welcomes* General Assembly resolution 52/198 of 18 December 1997, whereby the General Assembly decided to include in the calendar of conferences and meetings for 1998-1999 the sessions of the Conference of the Parties and its subsidiary bodies envisaged for that biennium;

6. *Reiterates* its appreciation to the Government of Germany for its generous contributions of DM 1 million to the secretariat, in addition to its commitments as a Party, and of a further DM 1,000,000 for Convention events organized by the secretariat;

7. *Approves* the creation of a new trust fund for the special annual contribution of DM 1 million from the Government of Germany to finance Convention events organized by the secretariat, made in accordance with the bilateral arrangements between the Government of Germany and the Convention secretariat, and requests the Executive Secretary to request the Secretary-General of the United Nations to establish the new trust fund, to be managed by the Executive Secretary;

8. *Approves* the staffing table for the secretariat under the 1999 core budget as follows:

9. *Confirms* its authorization to the Executive Secretary to make transfers between each of the main appropriation lines set out in part I, paragraph 1, above, up to an aggregate limit of 15 per cent of the total estimated expenditure for a given year for those appropriation lines, provided that in the process no appropriation line is reduced by more than 25 per cent;

10. *Reaffirms* that the working capital reserve maintained within the General Fund shall be set at a level of 8.3 per cent of core budget expenditure, including overhead charges;

11. *Requests* the Executive Secretary to report to the Conference of the Parties at its third session on the financial performance of the Convention budget for 1999;

12. *Further requests* the Executive Secretary to submit to the Conference of the Parties at its third session a proposed programme budget for the biennium 2000-2001, which should include a contingency provision for conference servicing costs in the event that the General Assembly of the United Nations decides not to provide resources for these activities in the regular United Nations budget for that biennium;

B. Amendment to the Financial Rules

13. *Amends* paragraph 12 (a) of the Financial Rules to read as follows:

"(a) Contributions made each year by Parties on the basis of an indicative scale adopted by consensus by the Conference of the Parties, and based on such a scale of assessments of the United Nations as may be adopted from time to time by the General Assembly of the United Nations;"

C. Indicative scale of contributions

14. *Adopts* the attached indicative scale of contributions to the General Fund of the Convention for 1999, adjusted so as to ensure that no Party contributes less than 0.001 per cent of the total, that no one contribution exceeds 25 per cent of the total and that no contribution from a least developed country exceeds 0.01 per cent of the total;

15. *Recalls* that, in accordance with paragraph 14 of the Financial Rules of the Convention, contributions for 1999 are expected on or before 1 January 1999 and that each Party should, as far in advance as possible of that date, inform the Executive Secretary of the contribution it intends to make and the projected timing of that contribution;

16. *Invites* Parties to the Convention to pay promptly and in full the contributions required to finance expenditures approved under part A, paragraph 1 above, as offset by the estimated contribution noted in paragraph 2.

II. The Supplementary Fund and the Special Fund of the Convention

The Conference of the Parties,

1. *Takes note* of the estimated requirements submitted by the Executive Secretary;

2. *Invites* Parties, as well as Governments of States not Parties, intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations, to make contributions to the Supplementary Fund established pursuant to paragraph 9 of the Financial Rules, in order to:

(a) Support the participation of representatives of non-governmental organizations from affected developing country Parties, particularly the least developed among them, in sessions of the Conference of Parties;

(b) Facilitate assistance to developing country Parties in accordance with article 23, paragraph 2(c), and article 26, paragraph 7 of the Convention, as well as the relevant articles of the regional implementation annexes;

(c) Advance other appropriate purposes consistent with the objectives of the Convention;

3. *Further invites* Parties, as well as Governments of States not Parties, intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations, to make contributions to the Special Fund established in accordance with paragraph 10 of the Financial Rules, in order to support the participation of developing, and in particular, least developed country Parties affected by desertification and/or drought, particularly those in Africa, in the sessions of the Conference of the Parties and its subsidiary bodies;

4. *Requests* the Executive Secretary to report to the Conference of the Parties at its third session on the status of the Trust Funds established under the Financial Rules.

(ii) Strategies for integrating traditional and local knowledge, know-how and practices with modern knowledge based on specific case histories; and

(iii) Mechanisms for promoting and exchanging successful approaches;

(b) To report accordingly to the Conference of the Parties at its third session;

4. *Requests* the United Nations Environment Programme to ensure that issues relating to linking information networks on traditional and local knowledge, know-how and practices to the national action programmes are addressed under the survey and evaluation of networks.

3. *Also notes with appreciation* the efforts made by the International Fund for Agricultural Development to establish the framework for the separate identity of the Global Mechanism within the International Fund for Agricultural Development as an organic part of the structure of the Fund, and looks forward to a prompt starting of its activities, in conformity with the provisions of the Convention and relevant decisions of the Conference of the Parties;

4. *Further notes with appreciation* the role of the Facilitation Committee with its expanded membership in supporting the work of the Global Mechanism and looks forward to the Committee's continued support;

They shall serve as the Bureau of the session. One of the Vice-Presidents shall act as Rapporteur. In appointing the Bureau, due regard shall be paid to the need to ensure equitable geographical distribution and adequate representation of affected country Parties, particularly those in Africa, while not neglecting affected country Parties in other regions. The offices of President and Rapporteur shall normally be subject to rotation among the regional groups recognized by the practice of the United Nations."

2. *Decides also* to replace rule 31 with the following:

"The Chairperson of the Committee on Science and Technology shall be elected by the Conference of the Parties. Unless the Conference of the Parties decides otherwise, the Chairperson of any other subsidiary body shall be elected by the Conference of the Parties. Each subsidiary body shall elect its own four Vice-Chairpersons, one of whom shall act as Rapporteur. The Chairperson and four Vice-Chairpersons of such subsidiary bodies shall be elected with due regard to the need to ensure equitable geographical distribution and adequate representation of affected country Parties, particularly those in Africa, while not neglecting affected country Parties in other regions and shall not serve for more than two consecutive terms."

II. RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE OF THE PARTIES

Resolution 1/COP.2

Solidarity with Central America

The Conference of the Parties,

Concerned at the devastation caused by Hurricane Mitch that led to the tremendous loss of thousands of lives, of infrastructure and environmental degradation in Honduras, Nicaragua, Guatemala, El Salvador, Belize, Costa Rica and Panama,

Aware of the high vulnerability of Central American and Caribbean countries to such climatic phenomena,

Concerned that such natural phenomena worsen soil degradation, especially in the Central American and Caribbean subregions, which are the most vulnerable to these effects,

Recognizing that these unfortunate events give special urgency to our deliberations in this conference and oblige us to look for new opportunities for common cooperation actions,

1. *Expresses* its strongest solidarity and deep condolences to the people and Governments of Central America after this tragic event;

2. *Invites* the international community, including intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, to contribute to the reconstruction and support with humanitarian assistance and other cooperative actions;

3. *Urges* all Governments, United Nations agencies, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, the private sector and society in general, to offer them technical and financial assistance for the effective execution of the national action plans of the affected countries and subregional programmes for combating desertification;

4. *Invites* support for the Central American initiatives emanating from the Presidential Summit convened in San Salvador, El Salvador, in the aftermath of the catastrophes which call for a sustainable reconstruction plan for Central America.

Resolution 2/COP.2
